Getting Ready for Nesting Season

Spring migration is underway, and that means some birds are already on the lookout for nesting sites. Why not give them a hand this year by providing a nest box? The lack of adequate nesting locations can cause birds to pass up otherwise suitable habitat, and putting up bird boxes can draw in a wider variety of species to your area.

Birds can be particular about where they nest, and different species have very different requirements for boxes and surrounding habitat. Fortunately, there are numerous resources available to help you decide what kind of nest box is right for you. The website nestwatch.org has a wealth of information about choosing, placing, and maintaining boxes for birds. The site also has an interactive tool called "Right Bird, Right House" to help you determine what birds nest in your region and type of habitat, and plans for nest boxes if you want to build them yourself. Be sure to give special consideration to those birds flagged as being "in decline" for your region, which may be particularly in need of nesting habitat.

Be sure to follow up with maintaining and monitoring your nest box, and be on the lookout for undesired competitors like house sparrows. Also consider leaving standing dead trees in place instead of removing them as long as they are not a safety hazard, as they provide great habitat for woodpeckers and other wildlife. The birds will thank you!

April Program

Veracruz: River of Raptors

Thursday, April 7, 7pm

Each September, hundreds of thousands of Broad-winged Hawks migrate over the state of Veracruz, Mexico, on their way to Central and South America. They are joined by other raptor species, too, and together they create a super spectacle for birders. From two prominent hawk watches, volunteers count the hawks as they pass overhead, streaming from one thermal to another.

Birders can also enjoy Scissor-tailed Flycatchers in migration, and see many endemic species including the tiny Bumblebee Hummingbird.

Other highlights of the area are the old capital of Xalapa, in the mountains, and wetlands which are home to the Pinnated Bittern and other species.

Historic sites include the home of Cortez, built in the early 1500s, and the museum of anthropology with priceless relics of the early Olmec and other Indian cultures.

Marilyn Campbell is a retired educator and naturalist, and served as Executive Director of the Illinois Audubon Society from 1994 to 2006. She enjoys travel and birding, and has a life list of 1313 species, with 638 in the ABA area.
