# Point Pleasant: A Paradigm of Ecological Restoration

Thursday, November 4th, 7pm CT

Join us on **Zoom** for a seminar with **Peter Goodspeed**, Director of Natural Resources for the Champaign County Forest Preserve District.

Point Pleasant, a 180-acre section of the Middle Fork River Forest Preserve, is a natural gem in Champaign County. Within a relatively small area, the site includes marsh, riparian, forest, savanna, and prairie habitats. This talk will discuss the history, ecological restoration, and current management of Point Pleasant.

Peter and his team are responsible for restoring and maintaining historically referenced, native ecosystems throughout the forest preserves.



Peter holds degrees in Biology and Conservation Ecology. Although Michigan is his home state, Peter has gained a deep appreciation for the native ecosystems of east-central Illinois.

Happy fall, everyone! As we get more into fall, migrating birds are all around, and many of our favorites are leaving us. My hummingbird feeder was very popular just a couple weeks ago, and now it hangs lonely and deserted. Our Sunday Morning Bird Walks have been going well, with many opportunities for lighthearted debate and education, given the complicated fall colors of migrating warblers. One bird of note was a Blackthroated Blue Warbler that our very own CCAS president, Colin Dobson, spent many hours tailing while on campus the other day.

I'm also very excited to announce the details for our Jasper-Pulaski Fish and Wildlife Area trip in November! We will be heading out to Medaryville, Indiana, to watch the great Sandhill Crane migration, where we are likely to see over 10,000 cranes as they fly into their evening roosting area! We will also stop on the way to visit Kankakee Sands, owned and managed by the Indiana chapter of The Nature Conservancy, and view their bison herd. All ages are welcome to join for all or part of the trip.

# **My Top Ten South African Birds**

Thursday, December 2nd, 7pm on Zoom

Our December speaker is our very own Program Chair, Alida de Flamingh! Alida will share with us some of her favorite birds from her motherland, South Africa. The diverse ecosystems in South Africa, from deserts and grasslands to dense forests, host many regionally endemic bird species, but South Africa is also well-known among the global birding community for its widespread assemblages of unique and spectacular birds.

Alida is a geneticist and ecologist specializing in wildlife conservation genetics and ancient DNA research. Alida grew up in South Africa but moved to the USA to pursue a Ph.D. in Ecology, Evolution and Conservation Biology, and is now a postdoctoral researcher in the Carl R. Woese Institute for Genomic Biology, University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign.
